Diwali: 15th October, 2009

Diwali, known as the Festival of Lights, is one of the many cultural festivals we celebrate at CIS. In many parts of India and Nepal, Diwali is celebrated as the homecoming of Rama, Sita and Lakshmana after a fourteen-year exile in the forest and Rama's victory over Ravana. According to legend, people lit lamps to light Rama's path to Ayodhya, his kingdom. It is a Diwali tradition to dress up in colorful clothes, dance and exchange sweets and gifts.

Kindergarten students will try their hand at some Diwali-related crafts on 15th October, before lunch. We will paint diyas (little lamps), make cards, do our special Diwali dance and decorate our hands with Mehndi.
